#### Neighborhood Announcements

**Bylaws vote** - We are voting for the same amendments as last month. Not turning in ballot is a no vote. Quorum is currently at 10% which we are looking to lower to 5%.

**Aldermen Updates** - Alderman Davis. Need for better communication between alderman and stakeholders. This can go a long way in achieving goals.

### Updated from DSI - Craig Heller

- Operates downtown CID.
- Working on adding cameras and Light my STL.
- Working of app for safety.
- Working on events such as lunchtime live.
- Focus on what holds back market. How to help projects get completed status.
- Innovation district is working on high speed Internet. Also working on light post banners for startup companies.
- Infrastructure Wash Ave Phase 3 for MX District. Bids are out and coming back at end of May. New sidewalks and lighting. Looking at SEMAC for traffic, 2 ways streets, bike lanes. Did not get EW gateway funds for 7th. Working to find funds for infrastructure improvements.
- Business retention. Landed momentum. Quite a few developments. Billion dol- lars in potential developments. 3 Boutique hotels. Railway Exchange Develop- ment. CPI.

#### Update on Homeless services - Eddie Roth

- Nearing completion of 2.5 million development called Biddle House.
- Services for homeless and housing opportunity.
- May be gap from Bridge closing and opening Biddle House.
- Comprises of 98 beds for single men. Services for 125 people.
- RFP is out for organization to run Biddle house. Will be selected soon.

### Presentation on violence prevention – Dr. Purnell

- Coordinated approach to gun violence.
- Launched after 188 homicides last year.
- Collaborative launched in Jan.

-Learned:

- most gun violence concentrated on small group of people
- 80% happens in certain neighborhoods
- Focused deterrence
- Violence interruption which means it treats violence like a disease
