Votes and voter turnout in Downtown ward precincts performed equal to or better than ward precincts in surrounding neighborhoods. Downtown's voter precincts voted at the same rate or better than others in the area in the 2016 Presidential Election, this is a major improvement over the 2012 Presidential Election thanks in large part to our efforts.

Advocated to **stop a street closure** and received streetscape improvements that would not have been made without our input. This effort included collecting signatures, developing media stories, and contacting elected officials.

Successfully advocated for small neighborhood businesses to halt the installation of parking pay stations that would have removed their patio spaces.

We ensure the voice of residents and small businesses in Downtown are heard at City Hall and Jefferson City on safety, business development, homelessness, infrastructure, and other issues facing our neighborhood.




