

BYLAWS OVERVIEW

PROPOSED BYLAW AMENDMENTS* – JAN 2020

Difference between "General" and "Associate" members

Clarifies definitions of small business
/ entity (per federal regulation)

Changes entity membership prohibition from "same registered address" to "common control"

Allows board to develop new classes of membership

PROPOSED BYLAW AMENDMENTS* – JAN 2020 Allows remote written ballot, as permitted by Missouri statute.

 Changes minimum membership tenure from 2 years to 1 year (also allows suspension of tenure if candidates are low)

 Specifies the duties of the Executive Director
